# From Father Joseph

# Christ in You, the Hope of Glory

"For this reason I kneel before the Father from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named:

- that he may grant you in accord with the riches of his glory to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in the inner self;
- and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith;
- that you, rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the holy ones what is the breadth and length and height and depth;
- and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge:
- so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Now to him who is able to accomplish far more than all we ask or imagine, by the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen."

- Ephesians 3:14-21

Genesis tells us that all human beings were created in the image and likeness of God. (Gen 1:27) Over the centuries there has been a lot of theological wrangling over what this means. Do we physically look like God? (No, God is spirit. Jn 4:24). Do we contain a spark of the Divine or merely a reflection of the Divine? Did God breathe a part of his own self into us when he enlivened the clay with spirit? (Gen 2:7) Perhaps a clue can be found in St. Paul's casual recollection of his own conversion experience in the first chapter of his Letter to the Galatians. There he speaks of the moment when God "... was pleased to reveal his Son *in* me." How could God have "revealed" the Christ in Paul if it wasn't already there? What God revealed to Paul was that the "image and likeness of God" -- His Son -- that was already living in Paul, even at a time when he openly thought of himself as an enemy of Christ.

We acknowledge this reality in our Baptismal Covenant when we pledge to "seek and serve Christ in all persons." This promise rests on the assumption that Christ exists to be served in every human being, whether they know it or not. The hope is that the inner Child of God will be revealed in each of us, and that we become grounded in the love which flows from this inner self.

The reason God hears our silent prayers is that God lives in us ... and above us and through us (Eph 4:6). That being said, it must also be clear that not everyone knows that God can be found within. Some know it but are too distracted with the outer world to give the inner self much time or attention. Some simply reject it. But those whose hearts know and embrace Christ in the inner self and align their lives to it also come to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge. This love is the power that created and is creating the world.

The writings of Paul are shot through with the idea that God lives in us. Jesus, in Paul's view, was the first human to be "filled with all the fullness of God." What Jesus was by nature, we become by adoption, by God revealing his Son in us. God hidden within is ...

"... the mystery that has been kept hidden for ages and generations but is now disclosed to the Lord's people. To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is

Christ in you, the hope of glory."

- Colossians 1:26-27

Our crafters meet from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. every Monday. We make prayer shawls which are given to people who need extra prayers and comfort. Our prayer shawl ministry was started in about 2007 and dozens of shawls have been made and given to others.

We also make items for the Christmas at Sea program, which has been a ministry of the Episcopal Church since 1898! Hats, scarves, and cowls, as well as other items,

can be knitted or crocheted to be sent to mariners through the Seamen's Church Institute.

Our needle arts group makes purple baby caps for the Period of PURPLE Crying. The *PURPLE* program is designed to help parents of new babies understand a developmental stage that is not widely known. It provides education on the normal <u>crying curve</u> and the <u>dangers of shaking</u> a baby. The caps are provided to new mothers at area hospitals.

For the past several years, we have provided scarves and hats for our unhoused neighbors, made baby blankets to be given at hospitals, decorated paper sacks for Laundry Love, and made other items which support ministries at St. Michael's.
