

#### Our WHY? HOW? WHAT?

<u>WHY?</u> "At St. Michael's, we are the voice of Christ in the modern world. We hold to the traditions of the Episcopal Church, which welcomes all who desire to know the love of God in Christ, regardless of age, social status, gender identity, race, or cultural heritage, because we are all made in the image of God. We do this through worship centered on the Word of God as found in the Bible, which promises hope, restoration, and reconciliation. We are committed to reaching out to those in the community who are marginalized by meeting their immediate needs through social ministry. We support families and understand the difficulty of finding a church that recognizes personal needs and limitations. Above all, at St. Michael's we care for others and seek to restore all people to unity with God and one another.

HOW? "At St. Michael's we live and share the love of Christ."

WHAT? is lived out through our commitment to 1) the homeless and hungry, 2) children's services, and 3) the environment. We support these initiatives primarily through our outreach ministries.

#### From the Senior Warden

The Rev. Joseph Farber, previously Vicar of the Good Shepherd Episcopal Church in Sapulpa, Oklahoma, and most recently Rector at the Church of the Transfiguration in Sisters, Oregon, is returning to Oklahoma as Priest-in-Charge at St Michael's Church, Norman. Bishop Poulson recently commented on the new call, "I'm delighted to welcome Father Joseph back home, not only to Oklahoma, but to a parish that is near and dear to him. I look forward to seeing Saint Michael's grow in vitality and in their sense of mission in Norman."

Father Joseph will officially begin his ministry at Saint Michael's on December 1, 2022. He and his wife Jan have bought a home in Norman and Jan has already arrived.

Some highlights from The Letter of Agreement between Father Farber, Saint Michael's, and Bishop Poulson:

All pay and benefits shall become effective on 12/01/2022 and may be adjusted by mutual consent.

#### Annual compensation and benefit figures to be paid by the Vestry:

- Gross Compensation (Stipend and Housing): \$52,000.00
- Pension Assessment (18% of Stipend and Housing): \$9,360.00
- Medical Insurance Premiums: Opted out due to coverage under Medicare
- Continuing Education Reimbursement: \$1,500.00
- Professional Expense Reimbursement: \$ 3,000.00
- Total Budgeted Compensation: \$ 65,860.00

Father Joseph's scheduled workweek is three and one-half (3 1/2) days of various combinations of either mornings, afternoons, or evenings reflecting the demands of this ministry.

Saint Michael's has made a commitment to our incoming Priest-in-Charge, and we must have an effective return of pledges to plan for anticipated needs and expenditures as we develop our 2023 Parish Budget.
