

From Father Joseph Farber

In Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek, the word for spirit, breath, and wind is the one word. The ancients thought of them, not as we perceive them through the filter of English, as three different things, but as one thing.

The Spirit of God which prepared the void for creation is also the Breath of God, bearing God's creative Word ("Logos") into the activity of creation. The very same Breath which breathed life into Adam flows into our lungs and enlivens our bodies. The wind in the trees, the wind in the desert and on the plains speaks to us constantly, and yet we do not hear, or know Whose voice it carries. As St. John complains, "The Logos was already in the cosmos, and the cosmos came into being through the Logos. But the cosmos did not understand the Logos."

What a difference it could make in our lives if we recovered the lost perceptions of the ancient world! What if, with every breath, we experienced taking the Spirit of God into our selves? What if every breeze spoke to us, carrying God's Wisdom, His living Word, into our hearts? What if God wasn't something we read about, heard about, or studied, but something we experienced as living and loving, something we steeped in, someone we drew into ourselves with every breath?

We do. We all do. But most of the time we are no more aware of it than a fish is aware of the water in which it swims. The narrative of the Bible helps us understand how an ancient people encountered and understood God. In Jesus, especially on the Cross, we see God's true nature revealed. But it's all useless information if we never make an effort to be in relationship with God, to connect to the reality of the God in whom we live and move and have our being. The Church has an essential role to play in helping us and the world make this connection. In the sacrament of the Church and, especially in the sacrament of Communion, we experience God in the fullness of both vertical and horizontal relationships.

Relationship is everything. Our relationships make us what we are, for good or ill. The way we relate to others makes them what they are and helps determine the way they relate to us. Just as the way we relate to our own parents affects the way we related to our children, so our relationship, or lack of relationship, to God affects every moment of our lives and every relationship we have. That's why love, not law, is the highest standard of relationship and of discipleship. Law can be observed even in the absence of relationship; but love requires that we be in relationship.

God is in the next breath you take. Be aware of it. Take a moment and be thankful. Try to align your heart with God's heart and your will with God's will. You will be amazed at how it transforms your life!
